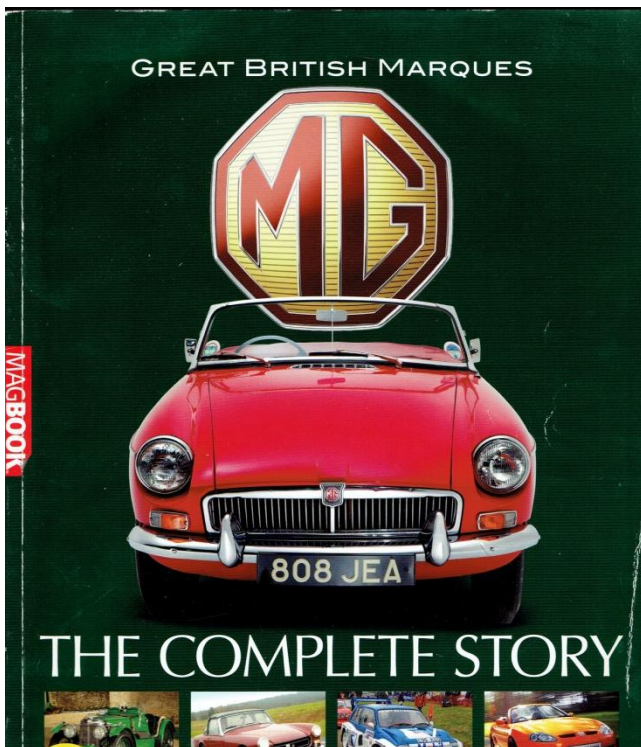


Book Reviews

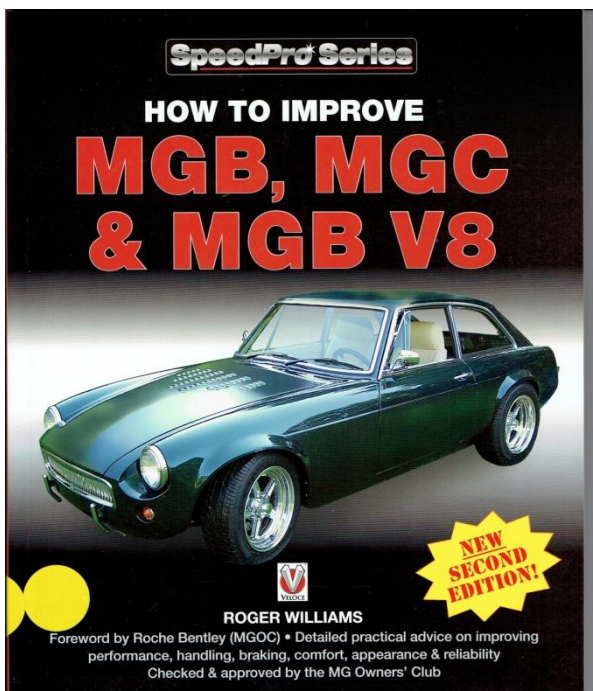
